In addition to offering disaster-preparedness training programs across the country to get individuals and communities ready for emergencies, we also have a disaster preparedness handbook available.

We work with local organizations and federal authorities. We mobilize where people are hungry and need basic comforts. We provide mobile showers, bottled water, and a clean blanket to anyone in need. We turn our properties into sites of refuge when needed. And we deliver emotional and spiritual care that first disasters and emergencies strike without much warning, but you can count on The Salvation Army to be on the spot, providing relief within hours, because we're already part of the community. Some effects of disasters are unseen – many survivors and first responders suffer emotional stress and trauma. The Salvation Army delivers vital emotional and spiritual care they need. The State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP) Program provides local governments with the funds to create housing programs to assist its income-eligible citizens. Clay County SHIP has successfully upgraded the quality of living standards by providing safe, decent, improved and affordable housing for the county's elderly, special needs, and income-eligible families.

The *Rapid Rehousing Program* assists *homeless families* in Clay County with obtaining a home that they will call their own. If approved, a family in our Rapid Rehousing Program can expect a maximum of one-year of ongoing assistance while actively working towards independence.

The *Eviction Prevention Program* assists families in Clay County who are *facing eviction* to maintain their current housing. If approved, a family in our Eviction Prevention Program can expect a maximum of 6 months of rental assistance (including delinquency) while actively working towards independence.
