- Read Joshua 3 & 4.
- In Joshua 3:7, what is the main objective of the divine intervention at the Jordan?
- Read Joshua 3:11. What is the significance of the Ark of the Covenant leading the way into the Jordan?
- In Joshua 4:18, the message was so obvious to those crossing the Jordan and is still prevalent for us today. What message is God communicating?

APPLICATION

In chapters 3 and 4 Joshua exhibits qualities of leadership that we would seek in our leaders today. Joshua was a leader willing to step up to the plate. In chapter 3:6-8, Joshua had no problem leading the way; and people were willing to follow. He was strong and optimistic. What stands out the most is his faithfulness to the guidance and word of God. How would you feel if people were saying that you were firm in your faith? That you were a person of prayer? Joshua showed unwavering loyalty and faith in God. Is Joshua someone you would follow? These two chapters contain great guidance for us today, as disciples of Jesus Christ. They show that God is in control. He sets apart those that He knows will lead others in His agenda. Where does your faith in God lie now? Does it reflect that of Joshua? If not, be in prayer and ask God to increase your faith as you remain obedient to Christ.
