


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Colossians 2:7

FAMILY MINISTRY

CC KIDS and **CC STUDENTS** partners with parents to raise up a generation to KNOW and FOLLOW Jesus.

Since its inception, children and students have been one of the top priorities of Christ's Church. Whether it is holding and rocking newborns, talking to an elementary kid about Jesus, or keeping pace with teens at summer camp, we are committed to do what it takes to have a voice in the lives of the next generation. To that end, we have carefully developed a program, backed by top facilities and resources, that allow them to experience the love of Jesus in a great environment. Twice a year we host a Family Dedication. Since the pandemic, 100 families have chosen to dedicate their families to following Jesus.

Each week, hundreds of volunteers devote their time and talents to ensure that our kids and student programs run safely and smoothly.

We currently serve more than 1500 kids and students each month from Birth through High School.

DID YOU KNOW?

We have 90,000 square feet of space devoted to family ministry across our campuses.

In addition to our own Christ's Church Academy, we serve 8 local public schools within our campus communities.

Over 1000 lbs of candy was given out at last year's Trunk or Treat, a fall event we host annually.

We've taken 700 kids and students to Summer Camp since 2021.

We have a ministry dedicated to special needs children called CCKIDS UNLIMITED.





GLOBAL OUTREACH

From Hurricane relief, to addressing food insecurities to caring for vulnerable women and children and providing parents a dignified way to provide Christmas for their children, Christ's Church has been at the forefront of meeting needs and loving others for 50 years.

This year we plan on reaching a whole nation for Christ!

Awaken Spain is a major prayer movement. Spain is the only European country that has not experienced revival. Among its 8500 cities, more than 7500 have no church. Awaken Spain seeks to cover all 17 regions of Spain in prayer, laying the groundwork for planting 1,700 churches in the next 10 years.

22% of our ministry budget goes toward Outreach.

We partner with 50 local and community organizations in the Northeast Florida area.

Christ's Church has helped plant churches on 6 continents and we currently work with 8 global partners.



LOCAL OUTREACH

What happens when Jesus' people assume the role of gathering the government, education, not-for-profit and private sectors together to solve a city's biggest issues? Things get done! Problems are eased and Jesus is recognized. This is the power of collaboration. Our most enduring contribution to our communities has been our ability to get people in the room to talk and act. Impact Clay, in Clay County and Transformation Jax in Duval County, are just two collaborations where the Christ's Church has a seat of influence.

PRISON MINISTRY

Founded in 2016, our Prison Ministry is an example of a successful partnership between God's people and government agencies. Utilizing the Emmaus correspondence program, inmates complete in-depth Bible Studies that include graded evaluations. These are returned to the ministry for feedback and encouragement from volunteers. We also hold services on site at several locations.

UNWAVERING FAITH

\$7.5 million a year comes to Christ's Church through generosity toward our general fund. Our general budget is anything but general. Amazing things happen and lives change day in and day out through ministries like CCKids, CCStudents, small groups, weekend services, Starting Point, care and recovery groups, men's and women's events, senior adults, local outreach and a host of other ministries.

Our top priorities are:

- · we will not compromise our daily/weekly giving
- build a healthy church for the whole family and all generations
- annual budget to make disciples, better disciples, and more disciples

UNCOMMON HOPE

Coming out of a global pandemic has created unprecedented needs in our community and around the globe. Over the year, we will offer uncommon levels of hope as we serve our global and local partners, including new initiatives in Northeast Florida and Spain. Our plan is to invest \$2 million in local and global initiatives.

Our top priorities are:

- the needs in our community and around the globe have never been greater
- · train the church for missional living
- launch a local initiative that solves the greatest need in our community
- create a ministry where all generations can engage with one another
- lead a global initiative sharing the Gospel with an entire country



UNSTOPPABLE LOVE

With an unstoppable love we will take radical risks to reach people far from God. This will enable the launch of a new campus, fuel an initiative to revive declining and dying churches, provide needed and ongoing improvements to existing campuses and significantly reduce our long-term debt by \$5.5 million. Debt slows us down from doing more to reach people and by reducing our debt, we'll save thousands of dollars in interest and free up more dollars for ministry in the long run.

Our top priorities are:

- risk to reach people far from God
- reviving churches who are unhealthy and declining to establish thriving local churches
- launch new campuses in identified church "deserts"
- launch campuses with the intent to establish an independent local church
- significantly reduce or eliminate our long-term debt so that the next generation will be debt free



WHERE DO WE START?

- **1. Pray continually** pray for the hearts of our people, that we will obediently listen with the intent of responding.
- **2.** Commit wholly be 100% all in and encourage others to join you.



- **3.** Celebrate passionately God is going to move in your life. Share loudly what He's doing.
- **4. Give generously** live and give in a way that stretches your faith.

CREATIVE WAYS TO PARTICIPATE

Sometimes we can overcomplicate our personal finances. Many times, we find ourselves thinking about whether or not we have "enough" money, when we really should be thinking more about how we will "prioritize" all that God has blessed us with!

The Example

Did you know that if **3000** people who call Christ's Church their family, committed to either begin giving in their discipleship journey for the first time, or increased their giving **\$200** a **month for the next 12 months** – WE WOULD MEET OUR OVERALL GOAL!

The Challenge

Think about that example for a second—How could you "prioritize" \$200 a month? What does that look like for you personally? Weekly, you would need to prioritize or set aside \$50 in order to accomplish this goal. Would that be a few less trips to Starbucks or Dunkin to get a coffee, or perhaps packing a lunch several days week? Maybe you can get creative and a family night out at the movies becomes a family game night at home?

The Reality

The reality is, not everyone may be able to contribute \$200 a month as shared in the example. Some may need to consider lesser amounts, and some may be able to consider greater amounts. The amount, however, is not what is most important about your commitment. It is where your heart is that is most important. As Jesus said in Luke 12:34 [NLT] "Wherever your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be." The "heart" represents the deepest and most intimate part of ourselves and the very source of our lives. The "treasure" represents what we prioritize as having the most value both today and in the future.

PRAYER AND PRAISE



HOW TO P.R.A.Y

There is no special formula for prayer. There are no "buzz words" or phrases that capture God's attention more than any other. Prayer is pouring your honest, surrendered heart out to God and seeking His answers to your struggles. When asked by His disciples about prayer, Jesus responded with the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:9-13).

"This, then, is how you should pray: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.""

Jesus' response points out four key attributes of prayer. We've made an acrostic to make it easy to remember every time you pray. This isn't a formula, but if you need a little direction in your prayers, this serves as a great guide.

PRAISE: Praise God for who He is and His attributes. Begin by giving Him your worship and adoration.

REPENT: Confess to God the things you have done in word, thought or deed which led you into sin. Confess and repent.

ASK: After you have spent time in praise and repentance, make your requests known to God by asking Him to provide your needs.

YIELD: God is always at work around you. Take time to notice when He invites you to join Him to become part of His mission.

WEEK 1: THE CHURCH

Matthew 16:13-18

13 When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?"

14 "Well," they replied, "some say John the Baptist, some say Elijah, and others say Jeremiah or one of the other prophets."

15 Then he asked them, "But who do you say I am?"

16 Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

17 Jesus replied, "You are blessed, Simon son of John, because my Father in heaven has revealed this to you. You did not learn this from any human being. 18 Now I say to you that you are Peter (which means 'rock'), and upon this rock I will build my church, and all the powers of hell[e] will not conquer it."

Matthew 28:18-20

18 Jesus came and told his disciples, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. 19 Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. 20 Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Psalm 71:17-18

This step of faith for Christ's Church is the largest thing we have ever done as a church. It is literally going to change our church, and it is a risk we are willing to take in light of God's Word and God's leading. We believe that God's work in us is unfinished and He is calling us to take our relationship with Him to a new level. How does generosity tie into the life of a disciple?

Is generosity an area of your life that God may intend to grow through the Rooted series?

PRAY for the Holy Spirit to help us do what the Bible says and share what we learned with one person.

WEEK 2: THE GOSPEL

Romans 1:1-16

1 This letter is from Paul, a slave of Christ Jesus, chosen by God to be an apostle and sent out to preach his Good News. 2 God promised this Good News long ago through his prophets in the holy Scriptures. 3 The Good News is about his Son. In his earthly life he was born into King David's family line, 4 and he was shown to be the Son of God when he was raised from the dead by the power of the Holy Spirit. He is Jesus Christ our Lord. 5 Through Christ, God has given us the privilege and authority as apostles to tell Gentiles everywhere what God has done for them, so that they will believe and obey him, bringing glory to his name.

6 And you are included among those Gentiles who have been called to belong to Jesus Christ. 7 I am writing to all of you in Rome who are loved by God and are called to be his own holy people.

May God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ give you grace and peace.

8 Let me say first that I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith in him is being talked about all over the world. 9 God knows how often I pray for you. Day and night I bring you and your needs in prayer to God, whom I serve with all my heart by spreading the Good News about his Son.

10 One of the things I always pray for is the opportunity, God willing, to come at last to see you. 11 For I long to visit you so I can bring you some spiritual gift that will help you grow strong in the Lord. 12 When we get together, I want to encourage you in your faith, but I also want to be encouraged by yours.

13 I want you to know, dear brothers and sisters, that I planned many times to visit you, but I was prevented until now. I want to work among you and see spiritual fruit, just as I have seen among other Gentiles. 14 For I have a great sense of obligation to people in both the civilized world and the rest of the world, to the educated and uneducated alike. 15 So I am eager to come to you in Rome, too, to preach the Good News.

16 For I am not ashamed of this Good News about Christ. It is the power of God at work, saving everyone who believes—the Jew first and also the Gentile.

WEEK 2: THE GOSPEL

Ephesians 2:1-5

2 Once you were dead because of your disobedience and your many sins. 2 You used to live in sin, just like the rest of the world, obeying the devil—the commander of the powers in the unseen world. He is the spirit at work in the hearts of those who refuse to obey God. 3 All of us used to live that way, following the passionate desires and inclinations of our sinful nature. By our very nature we were subject to God's anger, just like everyone else.

4 But God is so rich in mercy, and he loved us so much, 5 that even though we were dead because of our sins, he gave us life when he raised Christ from the dead. (It is only by God's grace that you have been saved!)

1 Corinthians 2:1-5

1 When I first came to you, dear brothers and sisters, I didn't use lofty words and impressive wisdom to tell you God's secret plan. 2 For I decided that while I was with you I would forget everything except Jesus Christ, the one who was crucified. 3 I came to you in weakness—timid and trembling. 4 And my message and my preaching were very plain. Rather than using clever and persuasive speeches, I relied only on the power of the Holy Spirit. 5 I did this so you would trust not in human wisdom but in the power of God.

1 Corinthians15:1-4

1 Let me now remind you, dear brothers and sisters, of the Good News I preached to you before. You welcomed it then, and you still stand firm in it. 2 It is this Good News that saves you if you continue to believe the message I told you—unless, of course, you believed something that was never true in the first place.

3 I passed on to you what was most important and what had also been passed on to me. Christ died for our sins, just as the Scriptures said. 4 He was buried, and he was raised from the dead on the third day, just as the Scriptures said.

WEEK 3: THE HEART

Matthew 5:13-16

13 "You are the salt of the earth. But what good is salt if it has lost its flavor? Can you make it salty again? It will be thrown out and trampled underfoot as worthless.

14 You are the light of the world—like a city on a hilltop that cannot be hidden. 15 No one lights a lamp and then puts it under a basket. Instead, a lamp is placed on a stand, where it gives light to everyone in the house. 16 In the same way, let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father."

Mark 12:28-34

28 One of the teachers of religious law was standing there listening to the debate. He realized that Jesus had answered well, so he asked, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?"

29 Jesus replied, "The most important commandment is this: 'Listen, O Israel! The LORD our God is the one and only LORD. 30 And you must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind, and all your strength.' 31 The second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' No other commandment is greater than these."

32 The teacher of religious law replied, "Well said, Teacher. You have spoken the truth by saying that there is only one God and no other. 33 And I know it is important to love him with all my heart and all my understanding and all my strength, and to love my neighbor as myself. This is more important than to offer all of the burnt offerings and sacrifices required in the law."

WEEK 3: THE HEART

- 33 "Then a despised Samaritan came along, and when he saw the man, he felt compassion for him. 34 Going over to him, the Samaritan soothed his wounds with olive oil and wine and bandaged them. Then he put the man on his own donkey and took him to an inn, where he took care of him. 35 The next day he handed the innkeeper two silver coins,[c] telling him, 'Take care of this man. If his bill runs higher than this, I'll pay you the next time I'm here.'
- 36 "Now which of these three would you say was a neighbor to the man who was attacked by bandits?" Jesus asked.
- 37 The man replied, "The one who showed him mercy." Then Jesus said, "Yes, now go and do the same."

James 2:14-17

14 What good is it, dear brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but don't show it by your actions? Can that kind of faith save anyone? 15 Suppose you see a brother or sister who has no food or clothing, 16 and you say, "Good-bye and have a good day; stay warm and eat well"—but then you don't give that person any food or clothing. What good does that do?

17 So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless.

Colossians 2:1-7

1 I want you to know how much I have agonized for you and for the church at Laodicea, and for many other believers who have never met me personally. 2 I want them to be encouraged and knit together by strong ties of love. I want them to have complete confidence that they understand God's mysterious plan, which is Christ himself. 3 In him lie hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.

4 I am telling you this so no one will deceive you with well-crafted arguments. 5 For though I am far away from you, my heart is with you. And I rejoice that you are living as you should and that your faith in Christ is strong.

6 And now, just as you accepted Christ Jesus as your Lord, you must continue to follow him. 7 Let your roots grow down into him, and let your lives be built on him. Then your faith will grow strong in the truth you were taught, and you will overflow with thankfulness.

Ephesians 4:11-15

1 Thessalonians 1:2-3

2 We always thank God for all of you and pray for you constantly. 3 As we pray to our God and Father about you, we think of your faithful work, your loving deeds, and the enduring hope you have because of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Numbers 9:18-19; 18:23

18 In this way, they traveled and camped at the LORD's command wherever he told them to go. Then they remained in their camp as long as the cloud stayed over the Tabernacle. 19 If the cloud remained over the Tabernacle for a long time, the Israelites stayed and performed their duty to the LORD.

Their good deeds will be remembered forever."

10 For God is the one who provides seed for the farmer and then bread to eat. In the same way, he will provide and increase your resources and then produce a great harvest of generosity in you.

TO CONSIDER

Paul impresses upon the early church at Corinth and upon US as the Church of today, the importance of giving in such a way that we believe God will 'increase our store of seed' and will 'enlarge the harvest of our righteousness.' But focus in on verse 11: ...you will be enriched in every way so that you can always be generous. Why does God give resources to us? So that we can have more money for ourselves? So that we can feel more secure? So that we can impress others and feel significant? NO! It's so that we can be generous on every occasion!

If you were God, would you give you more money?

We often say, "If I had more resources, then I would give more." Do you feel God could trust you with more? Why or why not?

Do you believe God can and will do something through you and in you during this ROOTED season? How do you think God is seeking to use your resources in such a way that brings glory to Him and shines alight on His name?

What is preventing you from surrendering to God and His plan for your life?

PRAY for the Holy Spirit to help us do what the Bible says and share what we learned with one person.

14 Jesus replied, "Friend, who made me a judge over you to decide such things as that?" 15 Then he said, "Beware! Guard against every kind of greed. Life is not measured by how much you own."

16 Then he told them a story: "A rich man had a fertile farm that produced fine crops. 17 He said to himself, 'What should I do? I don't have room for all my crops.' 18 Then he said, 'I know! I'll tear down my barns and build bigger ones. Then I'll have room enough to store all my wheat and other goods. 19 And I'll sit back and say to myself, "My friend, you have enough stored away for years to come. Now take it easy! Eat, drink, and be merry!"

20 "But God said to him, 'You fool! You will die this very night. Then who will get everything you worked for?'

21 "Yes, a person is a fool to store up earthly wealth but not have a rich relationship with God."

I Timothy 6:17-19

17 Teach those who are rich in this world not to be proud and not to trust in their money, which is so unreliable. Their trust should be in God, who richly gives us all we need for our enjoyment. 18 Tell them to use their money to do good. They should be rich in good works and generous to those in need, always being ready to share with others. 19 By doing this they will be storing up their treasure as a good foundation for the future so that they may experience true life.

Reflect on this and share your heart, thoughts, nervousness, excitement and prayers with your group as it relates to this.
